
17 million people live in an area of approximately 41,500 km², making the Netherlands one of the most densely populated countries in the world.





At the start of our programme, we went to Charleroi, Belgium to meet the manager and some employees of ABB, a Swedish-Swiss multinational tech company. ABB presented their situation regarding client services and asked us to find different ways to offer better services to their clients. Every week we studied the company and thought about different solutions. At the end of the programme we presented in front of ABB and their managers graded us. This for me was a real-life experience.

IBM exchange

I thought my programme, IBM exchange - minor Finance & Accounting - would just be about numbers, but I was mistaken. I had to work on actual problems of a company and do research on financial forms, assignments such as crowdfunding and how to get companies started, which are all in my opinion, extremely interesting. My advice: When you get an assignment, work on it! The lecturers will expect a lot from you. In the end, you will notice that you learned something new and that all the hard work was worth it.

Supply Chain Management

The programme I chose is a demanding one, with many things happening at the same time and with deadlines that need to be met. What I liked most was an online group game called “The Cool Connection” where students form a team to run a business. Each team member is responsible for a department (Supply Chain, Purchasing, Sales and Finance). This game gave me an insight on how a company works. The lesson I learned is the staff you hire can make or break a company.

Services



Our locations

RUAS has over 10 locations within the city of Rotterdam. There are many services which RUAS offers, such as comfortable and modern libraries, IT services, access to printers, PCs or laptop service support. Also, every location is equipped with a canteen. A few locations also have a grand cafe or a special coffee bar.



I like to go for a stroll around the city. A few of my friends bought a sports card for Erasmus sport (erasmussport.nl) which is close to the Kralingse Zoom campus. There you can try one of the 50 different sports, make use of professional trainers and instructors or join 1 of the 22 student sport associations. My friends do some fitness there, but when the weather is nice they prefer to go for a run. That way you can enjoy your sports and the skyline of Rotterdam at the same time..



Living in Rotterdam

Your finances will influence your standard of living and overall experience during your stay abroad. Therefore, it is important to draw up a budget for your basic needs and personal preferences. On average students spend between € 5000 and € 7000 per semester.

Housing

RUAS meets part of the demand for accommodation by international students. We have reserved approximately 220 furnished rooms at the largest provider of student housing (SSH) in the Netherlands. 
